Course Title: Navigating the Uniform Grants Regulation Changes: 2 CFR 200

1. What business or organizational need does this course address?

The Office of Management and Budget's (OMB) 2026 revisions to the Uniform Grants Regulation (2 CFR 200) affect how organizations manage federal awards, document costs, and demonstrate compliance. It is critical for grant managers, recipients, pass-through entities, auditors, and compliance professionals to understand these updates and evaluate their impact on existing policies, procedures, and internal controls.

This half-day course provides a practical overview of the 2 CFR 200 updates and what will be involved in implementing the changes. Through facilitated discussion and a comprehensive overview of the updates to each subpart, participants will gain insight into key updates affecting administrative requirements, cost principles, and audit requirements. The course also provides context for understanding the regulatory update process and preparing organizations for implementation.

2. Who should attend?

Grant professionals who are familiar with 2 CFR 200 and want to learn about the 2026 changes and the new Uniform Grants Regulation.

3. What will I learn how to do in this course?

- Identify key changes to the Uniform Administrative Requirements and assess their implications for grant management practices
- Understand key changes to definitions and general provisions in Subparts A and B and assess the implications for compliance responsibilities
- Evaluate revisions to pre-award and post-award requirements in Subparts C and D and determine actions needed to maintain compliance throughout the grant lifecycle
- Analyze updates to the cost principles in Subpart E and determine how the changes may affect cost allowability, documentation, and financial management practices
- Evaluate revisions to the Audit Requirements in 2 CFR 200 and identify potential changes to the audit process

4. What kinds of activities are included in this course?

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Lecture, discussion, and action planning.
