1. What business or organizational need does this course address?

Gain a practical understanding of Financial Improvement and Audit Readiness (FIAR) Guidance in the Department of War, even for those without an accounting or audit background. Discover how internal controls, accurate documentation, and timely reporting help protect taxpayer dollars, reduce risk, and support mission readiness. Explore real-world examples and common root causes of audit findings, and learn simple, effective actions that personnel at all levels can take to improve transparency, accountability, and compliance with federal financial standards.

2. Who should attend?

This course is intended for all Department of War personnel whose roles support financial stewardship, internal controls, and audit readiness activities that contribute to achieving the Department's goal of a clean financial statement audit.

3. What will I learn how to do in this course?

- Understand the purpose of financial audits and how oversight and mandates influence audit readiness across agencies
- Describe how agencies prepare standardized financial reports and how auditors evaluate those reports to assess accuracy and identify risks
- Distinguish the roles of financial systems, data quality, and internal controls in supporting audit readiness and protecting agency assets
- Explain financial process risks and the function of audit trails in supporting financial integrity
- Recognize how agencies diagnose audit problems and manage solutions through corrective actions
- Identify daily practices and agencywide strategies that sustain audit readiness and promote accountability

4. What kinds of activities are included in this course?

Individual, small-group, and large-group exercises; lecture, discussion, action planning
